EARTH STEWARDS PROGRAMS

Our Earth Stewards Project (ESP) provides high school students with opportunities for service learning in our community. At the same time, they build relationships with environmental and land management organizations that need volunteers, interns, and employees. Participating in these programs, and making a positive impact during their final years of primary education, supports these students' social and emotional health. It also allows them to consider career paths that benefit their communities and the environment.







COMMUNITY HAPPENS HERE

Throughout the year, we provided opportunities for people to come together, learn, and find community. From workshops offering skills to community gatherings celebrating nature, most of our programs are free -- and they are making an impact. The Museum stands out as a place for individuals and partner organizations to share a love of nature and be inspired to protect it. Our mushroom-themed programs helped over 800 people connect with the fantastic world of fungi. When extreme weather events impacted our region, we met the moment by quickly creating programs to support families affected by flooding, a day of information on storm resources, and educational programs on the historical context of these events and how each of us can consider our climate future.

EXHIBITS



More people visited the Museum than ever this year. Our celebrated *The Art of Nature* exhibit featured 45 artists this spring, the most we have ever been able to display. Each year this exhibit is different and inspiring. We were thrilled to showcase 3-D artwork, including origami flowers, clay mushrooms, and resin-printed nudibranchs. Our correlating public programs were highly attended and gave participants the opportunity to learn from the artists and to immerse themselves creatively.

INSPIRE UNDERSTANDING

This year we produced two new original exhibits. *Maritime Mysteries and Monsters* featured collections items and collaboration with local ocean research organizations. With donor support, the tapertail ribbonfish cast was conserved and received a new case. Returning to public display, the ribbonfish made the exhibition a perfect backdrop for our annual Museum of the Macabre celebration. *The Inner Lives of Shells* showcased recent additions to our extensive seashell collections, highlighting shells native to our region and how a changing climate and human behavior impact the remarkable species that dwell within them.

The Museum team has been thrilled to support the discovery of a molar from a **Pacific mastodon** (*Mammut pacificus*) found and recovered from Rio Del Mar State Beach. The fossilized tooth is only the second recorded mastodon specimen from Santa Cruz County. A mastodon skull found in Aptos in 1980 (seen below) is already part of the Museum's permanent collections. In collaboration with California State Parks, we look forward to learning more about this ancient elephant-like creature and what it can tell us about our region's natural history. As research continues, we'll provide updates on the preservation and exhibition of this fascinating find with a story that captured the world's attention.



Amidst mastodon mania, there has been a lot happening in our collections. Former Museum staff member Sally Legakis, and spouse, Brian, volunteered to help digitize and rehouse 165 important fragile egg specimens from our founding collections. Wayne Thompson, a volunteer and previous staff member, signed on as Paleontology Collections Advisor. Archivist Debra Roussopolis became our first dedicated historic collections processing volunteer. The Museum received the American Institute for Conservation's Collections Assessment for Preservation, or CAP, to help improve collections care, making 2023 an exceptionally productive year.






